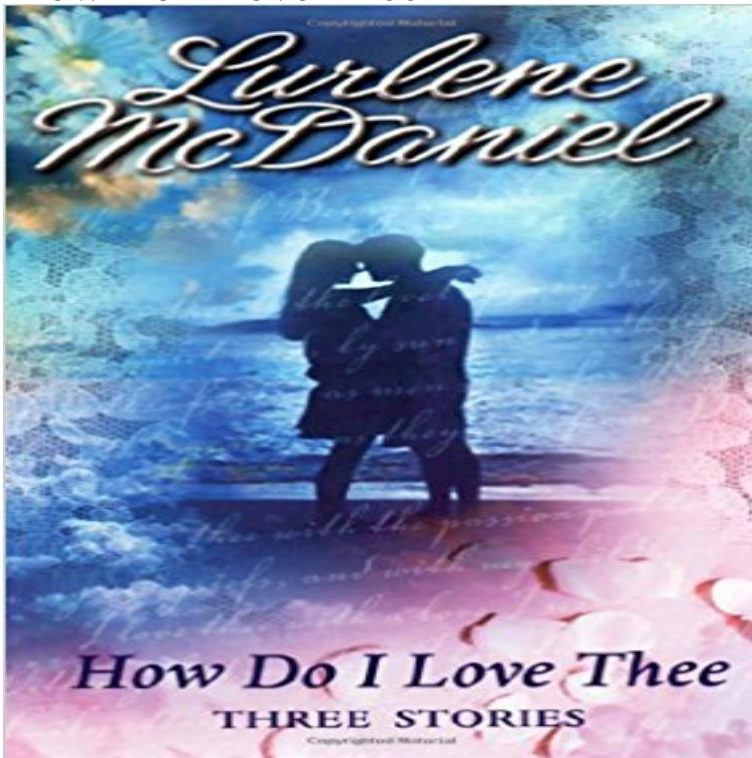


How Do I Love Thee
