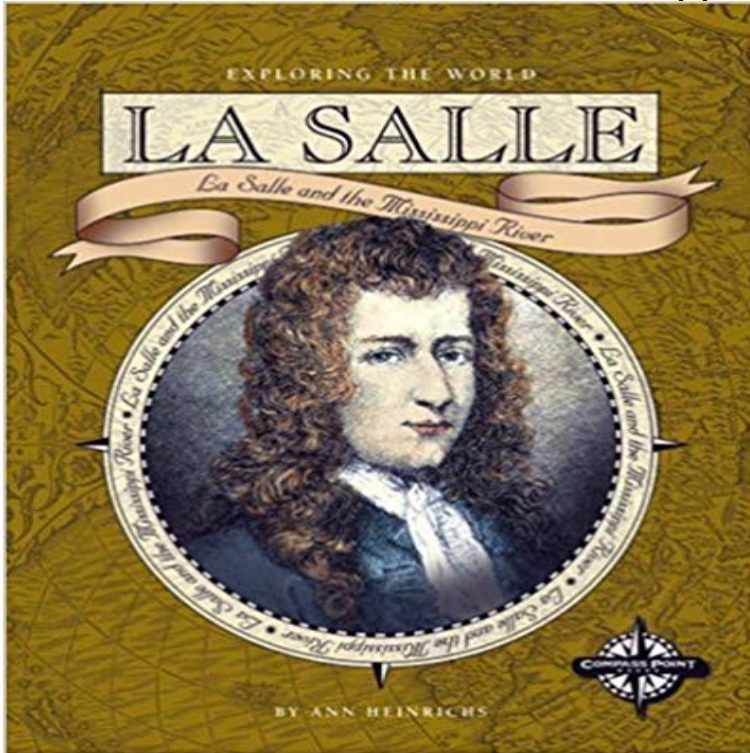


## La Salle: La Salle and the Mississippi River (Exploring the World)
