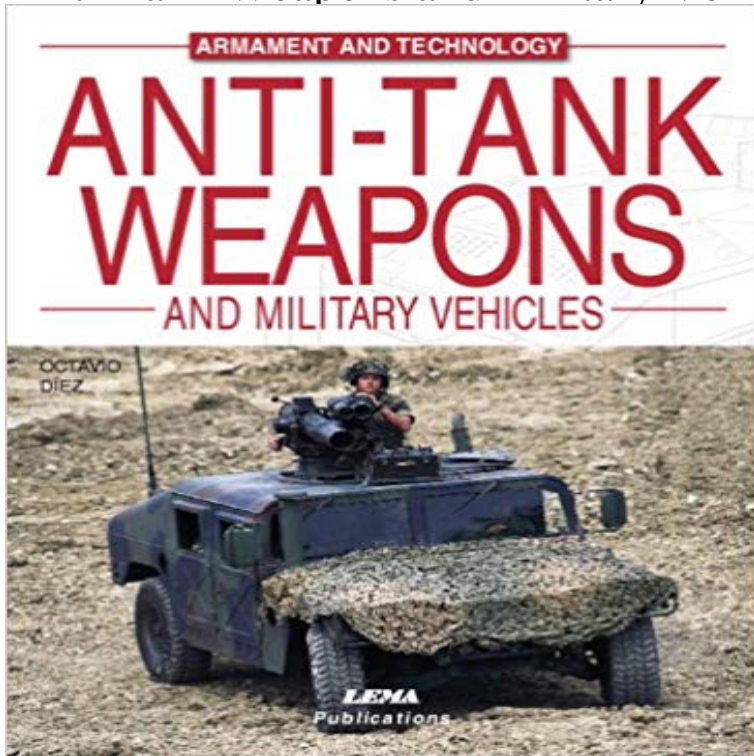


Anti-Tank Weapons and Military Vehicles
