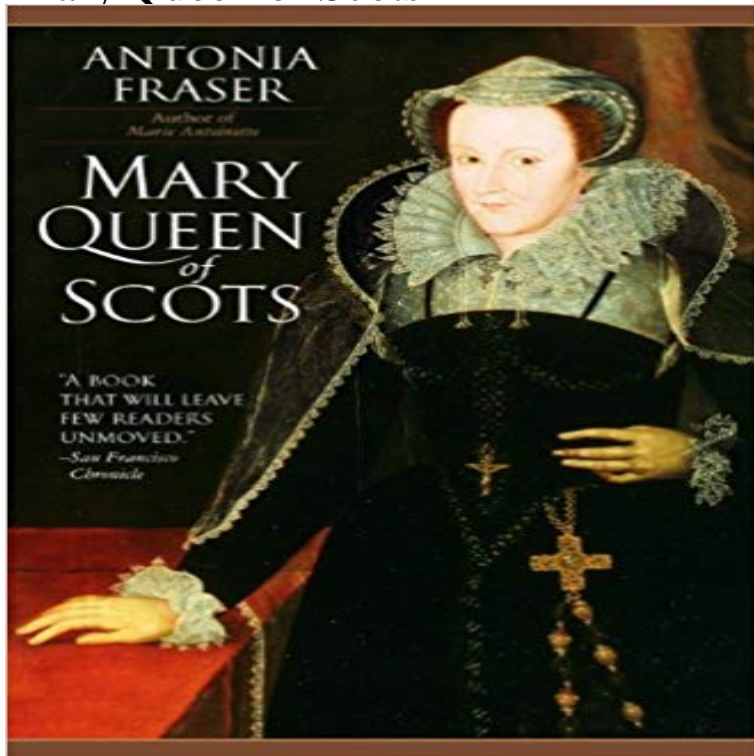


Mary Queen of Scots
