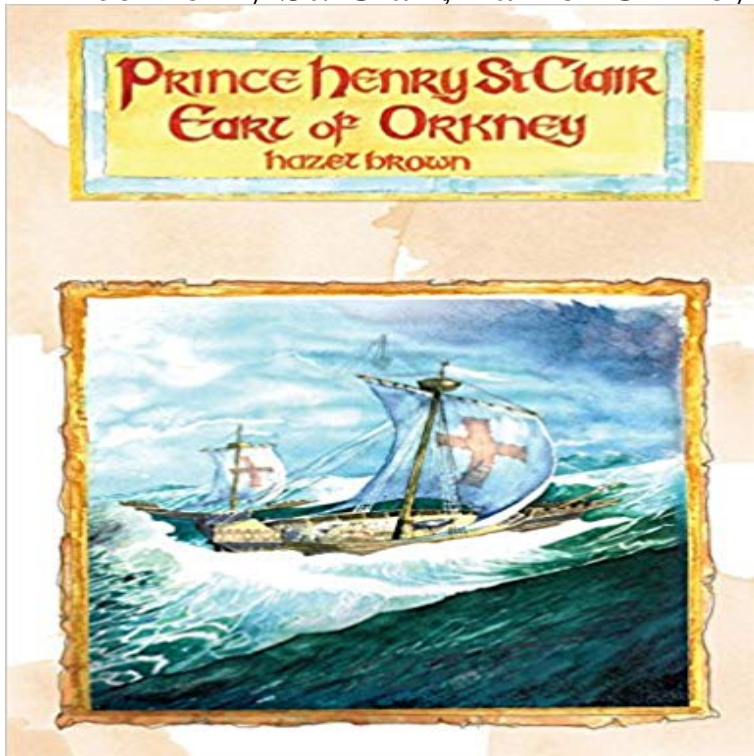


Prince Henry St. Clair, Earl of Orkney
