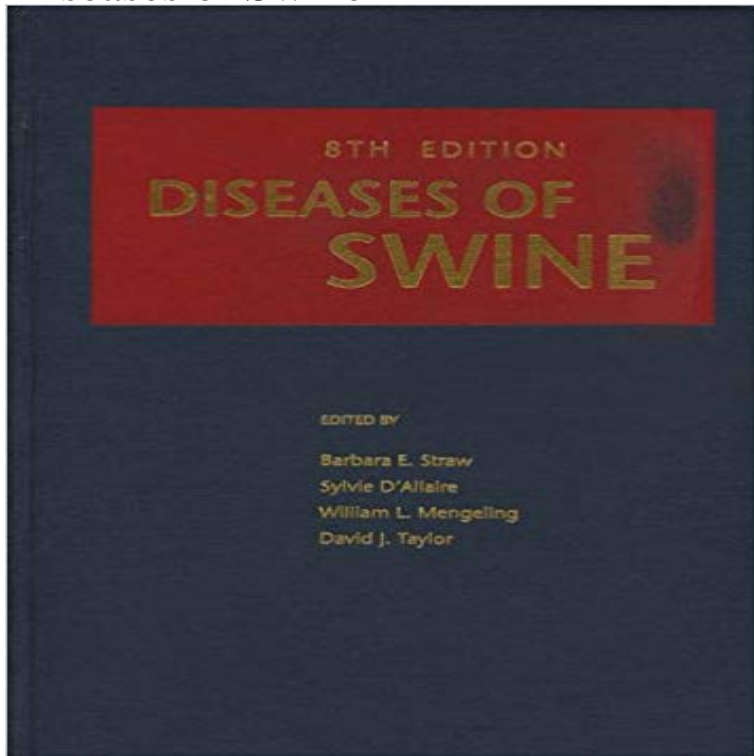


Diseases of Swine
