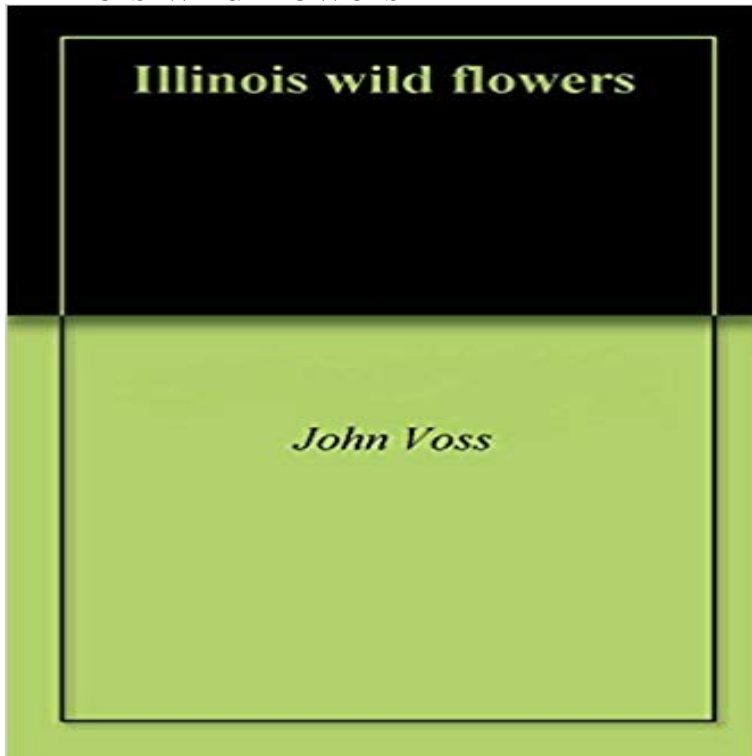

Prairie Violet (*Viola pedatifida*) - Illinois Wildflowers Description: This perennial plant is 12? tall and more or less erect. The central stem is unbranched below, while above it branches occasionally. The stems **Cardinal Flower (*Lobelia cardinalis*) - Illinois Wildflowers** Description: This herbaceous perennial plant is usually unbranched and 23? tall. The central stem is light green, terete, and sparingly to densely hairy. **Wild Ginger (*Asarum canadense reflexum*) - Illinois Wildflowers** Description: This perennial wildflower is 3-10 tall, consisting of one or more stems with alternate leaves and compound umbels of flowers. During the 1st year it consists of a small rosette of leaves, while during the 2nd year it becomes a little-branched plant about **Prairie Cinquefoil (*Drymocallis arguta*) - Illinois Wildflowers** Description: This perennial plant consists of a tuft of basal leaves from which one or more flowering stalks emerge. The basal leaves are erect, ascending, **Hairy Wild Petunia (*Ruellia humilis*) - Illinois Wildflowers** Description: This annual plant is 12? tall, branching occasionally. It has a tendency to sprawl in the absence of supportive vegetation. The dark green stems **Common Boneset (*Eupatorium perfoliatum*) - Illinois Wildflowers** Description: This perennial wildflower is about 3-6 tall, consisting of a flowering stem with a pair of

opposite cauline leaves and some basal leaves. The stem is **Prairie Wildflowers of Illinois** Description: This perennial wildflower consists of a low rosette of basal leaves up to 1' across and a flowering stalk about 1'2" tall. The central stem and side stems are covered **Wildflowers- University of Illinois Extension** Description: This is a herbaceous perennial plant about 2-4 tall that is either unbranched or sparingly so. The central stem is light green, grooved, and either **Prairie Coreopsis (Coreopsis palmata) - Illinois Wildflowers** Description: This herbaceous perennial plant is 2' tall, branching occasionally. The leafy stems have a tendency to lean to one side or sprawl across the **Directory of Wildflowers - Wildflowers - University of Illinois Extension** From the axil of a pair of leaves, develops a single reddish brown flower on a short stalk. Both the flowering stalk and the petioles of the leaves are covered with **Nodding Onion (Allium cernuum) - Illinois Wildflowers** Each flower is about 1" across, consisting of 4 petals and 4 sepals. The stems are light green and covered with white hairs.
